There are so many ways that friends of West Texas Rehab can contribute to our new campus in Abilene. In our last *Round-Up* issue, we talked about using long-term appreciated assets. In this issue, we'll look at giving to our building campaign using a donor-advised fund.

There are a few potential advantages to using a donor-advised fund to support a capital campaign. **First**, you can get an immediate tax deduction for your contribution to the donor-advised fund. **Second**, you can have more control over how your money is used. And **third**, you can spread out your giving over time, which can be helpful if you're not able to make a large donation all at once. Donor-advised funds are flexible and tax-efficient ways to give.

Here are the main steps on how to use a donor-advised fund to support a capital campaign:

Do your research and **choose a donor-advised fund sponsor** who's a good fit for you.

Open a donoradvised fund account. This is usually simple and straightforward.

Make a

contribution to your donoradvised fund. You can contribute cash, securities, or other assets to your

donor-advised fund.

Recommend a grant to the capital campaign. After the grant is reviewed and approved by the donor-advised fund sponsor, the funds will be transferred to the charity.

FYI: While there are many local, regional, and national organizations who could serve as the sponsor for your donor-advised fund, if you're looking for a donor-advised fund sponsor in Abilene, you might consider the Community Foundation of Abilene. And in San Angelo, you might consider the San Angelo Area Foundation.

Here are some additional tips for using a donor-advised fund to support a capital campaign:

Start early. Capital campaigns can take years to complete, so it's important to start early. This will give you time to make a significant contribution and help the charity reach its fundraising goal. **Be flexible**. The needs of a capital campaign can change over time, so be flexible with your giving. If the charity needs to adjust their plans, you may need to adjust your grant recommendation as well.

Brenda Tidwell

Brenda Tidwell married her sweetheart when she was 17 years old. He was 19. For 64 years they have been together and for roughly 60 out of those 64 years they have been ranching in Coke County. "We ranch charolais and angus cows. It's work, but it's a great life," Brenda explains. And anyone that knows anything about ranching knows it is just that...hard work!

About 2 years ago, Brenda started experiencing pain in her right knee. "It has been bothering me for some time but I kept putting off getting it seen about. I finally had enough and went and saw an orthopedic surgeon. It was time for a knee replacement," Brenda says.

On January 24th, Brenda had knee replacement surgery. On January 26th, she came to West Texas Rehabilitation Center to start physical therapy with Gina Karr, PT, DPT. "I knew when I first met Brenda that she was going to be a star. She was motivated and ready to go.

It is important to start therapy as soon as possible after surgery to have the most successful recovery. I asked Brenda about her goals. We put a treatment plan together and got to work," Gina explains.

"When Gina asked me on my first day what my number one goal was at the conclusion of therapy I told her to be able to get out of the truck and open the gates on the ranch because my husband was ready for me to start helping again," Brenda laughs. The ranch keeps Brenda and her family busy so being active was a priority.

Gina has been working with Brenda for about 6 weeks. "I saw Gina at my appointments one on one and that was very important to me. It has been a great experience and I am very grateful and pleased with the care," Brenda says.

On her last day of therapy, Gina put

Brenda through a series of walking tests to assess how she is moving and progressing. She went from sitting to standing and then walking. Her range of motion, timing and balance greatly improved. Brenda was stronger and more confident!

At West Texas Rehab, we recognize that every patient's story will be different, every patient's goals will be different, and every patient's motivation will be different. Our job is to personalize a program that is achievable and fulfilling.

For Brenda, her goal was to get back to the ranch and open that gate!

Tell Your Texas State Senator and State Representative to Support Cranial Remodeling Orthoses in 2025

For thousands of families across Texas, cranial remolding orthoses (CROs) can provide life-changing care when their infant is diagnosed with deformational plagiocephaly, a condition in which the skull flattens due to factors including prolonged labor, forces in utero, neck stiffness, or torticollis. These custom devices work to reshape the head to approximate a "normal" appearance in moderate to severe cases, and in cases where conservative treatments (head repositioning, therapy, etc.) are ineffective. Coverage is not currently required in Texas, forcing parents and families to choose between incurring prohibitive out-of-pocket costs or watching their infant develop abnormally. HB 134 would have addressed the lack of access by requiring Medicaid and CHIP to fully cover CROs, ensuring that infants in need of this treatment can live the life they deserve.

Our Texas legislature had the opportunity to fund CROs during this legislative session. The bill successfully passed the House floor but failed to make it out of the Senate Health and Human Services committee to be voted upon.

Despite the lack of funding, West Texas Rehab has provided this service to over 131 infants in 2022 and are well on the way to surpassing that number in 2023. Please help by contacting your representatives to ensure this issue is brought up again during the 2025 Texas legislative session.









West Texas Rehabilitation Center is launching their *"Building for Patients: Today. Tomorrow. And Always. Capital Campaign.*" The mission of this campaign will be to raise funds needed to build a new state of the art, all encompassing, clinical facility in Abilene, Texas. The new,133,000 square foot facility will promote the highest quality patient care, improve efficiencies and safety for their ever-growing patient population, ensure cost savings, improve access and visibility to care with a prime, more accessible location, and enhance the overall morale of all who enter our doors.

The project includes moving our Abilene campus to land located at the corner of Covenant and Memorial Drive, north of Sam's Club. Our current buildings consist of 80K SF. The new building will have expansion capability of 40K SF as we continue to grow. The WTRC campus will be located on 16 acres with a total capital investment of \$77M. The building will house our corporate offices, patient and financial accounting departments, along with all of our therapy services to include pediatric and adult physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, hospice, audiology, orthotics, prosthetics, and employer services.
