

West Texas Rehab's Hospice of San Angelo Inpatient Care Unit

Expanding How We Care for Our Community.

At West Texas Rehabilitation Center, between our three locations, we care for over 850 patients daily. From treating a newborn child through our pediatric services, to being there during the final stages of life with hospice care, we take pride in being able to say that we truly serve all walks of life, from birth to death. But, in addition, we're constantly looking at ways we can improve healthcare and expand the way we care for our community. When it comes to inpatient services for end-of-life care, there's a glaring void in San Angelo.

As the only non-profit hospice provider in the Concho Valley, we felt it was our responsibility to fill this gap. Through a partnership with Shannon Medical Center, we are making a \$4.5M investment to remodel the 3rd floor of Shannon South into an inpatient hospice care unit that will not only meet this unmet need, but make this community proud. Serviced by West Texas Rehab's Hospice of San Angelo, this 15-bed unit will feature suites with a patient side and a family area so when patients are too sick to be at home, their loved ones can still stay with them and comfortably be by their side.

of Bryce Thieman, who passed away under the loving care of West Texas Rehab's Hospice of San Angelo.

This was made possible by a generous gift from the Thieman Family.

Like all of the services at West Texas Rehab Center, the care at this new facility will be provided regardless of the patient's financial circumstance. And we do mean care - because end-of-life care is the most precious journey of them all.

We are excited and proud to announce that construction is nearing completion and we will be ready to serve patients in this new space soon!



From Fightin' Fires to Fightin' Cattle

How does a retired firefighter from the Metroplex who owns a successful commercial landscaping company, end up moving to Coleman, Texas to own a livestock auction barn? Well, it turns it's pretty simple: just follow your dream!

That's right, when he was just a boy, John Robertson knew that one day....he wanted to own a livestock barn! "I've been around cattle and livestock my whole life with my dad, my whole family, and it was always a dream of mine to get into the cattle business," John reminisces. "My grandpa used to take me down to the Cleburne auction barn and, even then, I thought: one day I'm gonna own me a livestock barn!"

It was actually about five years ago that John and his wife, Christi, made the first contact with Bob and Sylvia

Eddington, long-time owners of the Coleman Livestock Auction and dear friends of West Texas Rehab Center. John recalls, "We had talked with Bob and Sylvia about buying the barn, but due to legal reasons and things like that, we couldn't do at that time. Then in 2020 during Covid, we got a phone call from Ross Burdick and the Eddingtons and started the process. Took about a year to get it done, and now we own an auction barn!" John and Christi, as well as their youngest son, Logan, loaded up and moved to Coleman, actually living just outside there in Santa Anna. Their oldest son, Colby, is still in the Dallas area running the landscape business, while Logan finishes high school and will graduate this year.

John told me, "To me, it's a dream come true. We've met a lot of great people, I mean, that's what you meet in west Texas! I've gotten to meet all the families in this community, and those that raise cattle in all the surrounding areas. Just a lot of great folks!"

One of the things that became clear to John and Christi with their purchase of the auction barn, was that there was a long-standing relationship between the Eddingtons and this place he'd never heard of called West Texas Rehab Center, the Rehab. John said, "It was the one-year mark of us buying the auction barn when all of a sudden folks from the Rehab wanted to

know if they could have their annual auction sale at my new sale barn. I said sure and it's begun what I like to think of as a great partnership. Now, Christi and I have gotten to know all of you as friends. You've become like family!

"And when I see the smiles on the faces of the people y'all help, like the little girl I saw at your Dinner Show, it doesn't just make it worth it, but something we can't wait to keep doing!" John and Christi have now started joining us for many of our Rehab events, and they particularly enjoy our yearly Dinner Shows. John once told Jason Prew, part of our Donor Relations team, "If I can add another \$1,000 or \$2,000 or \$3,000 or \$10,000....I just feel better and better every year that we keep raising more money for you guys!" How about that!

Needless to say, we at West Texas Rehab have loved the relationship we've had with Coleman and the many years of help they've provided our patients. And now, getting to continue that relationship with the John and Christi Robertson, well that's kind of a dream come true for us, too!

PATIENT spotlight by CHUCK RODGERS, VP OF DEVELOPMENT



At West Texas Rehab, we have so many stories we'd love to tell you. Stories of hope and healing that have transformed lives once marked by very difficult circumstances. They are stories only YOU could make possible. And in the case of sweet, little Oakley, it's a story you are still making possible!

Imagine being a young couple just moving through life with your three wonderful, healthy daughters (11, 8, and 4), where most of your worries are the same as other families. Who's picking up the kids? What's for dinner? Are we saving enough for their college? "Mom/Dad, I need help with my homework." You're living life pretty much like everyone else.

That was the life David and Allison, and their daughters, Gentry, Emberly and Hartley were living. They had always wanted 4 children so, when Allison got the news that she was pregnant, they were all VERY excited.

Because of Allison's age, her doctor suggested having some additional testing around the eight-week mark of her pregnancy. This additional testing would serve as an early check for any complications, and also reveal if they were having their fourth girl (or if they were finally having a boy). Allison told her doctor, "We can do the test, but it doesn't matter what the results show—we are having this baby!" When they received the results, they found out two important things. First, they were having another girl—Oakley Hope. Second, Oakley was showing to have an increased risk for a chromosome abnormality, which would most likely be Down syndrome.

This news started a chain reaction of other tests, and at their 20-week sonogram, they confirmed Oakley did have Down syndrome, but also a heart abnormality. Following several more intensive sonograms, the news about Oakley's little heart took shape. Oakley had an Atrioventricular septal defect (AVSD) with a full AV canal.

Oakley was born at Hendrick Medical Center, and she spent a week in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) until she was strong enough to go home to wait for her open-heart surgery. On March 10, 2022, at only four months old, Oakley was admitted to Cook Children's Hospital in Fort Worth. Oakley underwent open-heart surgery to repair her AVSD. And...after just 10 days post-operative, Oakley was released to go home to continue healing.


When little Oakley returned to Abilene, David and Allison brought her straight to West Texas Rehab. One of the first things Oakley was going to need from the Rehab was physical therapy (PT). Our head of pediatrics, JoBeth Willis, is a physical therapist and has been with Oakley since the beginning. JoBeth is a gifted therapist and knows Oakley's story well.

JoBeth told me, "If you ever come to my office, you'll see a sign that's from Psalm 127:3 – Children Are A Gift from God. And let me tell you, that little Oakley is truly a gift from God. Not only to me but to her amazing parents and sisters. If you asked me to describe Oakley in a few words, they would be spicy, full of joy and life, and...plain and simple...absolutely adorable!"

This living miracle of a child, who was born with so many obstacles, is walking, running, throwing, catching, and kicking a ball. She is starting to say a few words. She loves coming to the Rehab to work on her strength, using all the amazing and fun equipment the Rehab has been blessed with.

JoBeth met Oakley at West Texas Rehab when she came in for a NICU follow-up evaluation in November 2021. As blessed as JoBeth and all of the Rehab therapists are to be able to work with Oakley, they'll be the first to tell you that, early on, things were tough.

JoBeth recalls, "When I first met this little strawberry blonde baby girl that was born



at 38 weeks with a heart defect that would require a massive open-heart surgery, this sweet baby with Down syndrome weighed 6 pounds 11 ounces and had just spent the last week in the NICU in Abilene. Oakley was so medically fragile. And her skin was almost translucent due to her oxygenation being so low from her heart defect."

Oakley did not move much, slept a lot, and could barely move her arms or legs off the surface of the therapy mat. She was unable to lift her head due to her hypotonia (poor muscle tone) and weakness. JoBeth recommended seeing her only once a month, only because she feared exposure to illness. JoBeth said, "I didn't want anything we were doing to stress her heart any more than we had to until her scheduled open heart surgery at Cook Children's Hospital in Fort Worth."

Oakley progressed slowly the next 4 months. The highest her oxygenation level ever got was still below 86%, so all of the Rehab therapists were worried and anxiously ready for Oakley to have heart surgery. JoBeth remembers, "I saw her 21 days after her March 10, 2022 openheart surgery. The procedure was a huge success, but we continued to want to see her monthly until she was released from any cardiac precautions. She had a healing incision down her sternum and, trust me, there's nothing more unnerving than handling a sweet, tiny 4-month-old infant with an incision down the front of her chest."

By June, Oakley's oxygenation was improving, her weight had climbed to 11 pounds and her stamina and medical fragility were improving, so she started coming to the Rehab weekly. JoBeth continues weekly physical therapy with Oakley to this day.

With a smile on her face, JoBeth says, "Interestingly, Oakley did not always love physical therapy like she does now. In fact, it was after her heart surgery that we realized she had strong lungs, which she'd use to let out loud cries, often during physical therapy. There were days that I got so worried about how mad and upset she became that I wasn't sure how we'd make it. That's when I would get this small, reassuring smile from her mom, Allison, and that was all the encouragement I needed to keep pushing."


Of course, since she was at West Texas Rehab, Oakley was also getting some difficult and frustrating therapy on feeding from one of our speech language pathologists, Betsy Ambrose. JoBeth jokingly said, "I'm pretty sure she loved Betsy way more than she loved me!"

Then it was on to the pediatric treadmill, because Oakley had to start working on walking. As she neared 2 years old, JoBeth again struggled thinking, "Is she ever going to walk?" But, of course, this strong and amazing little girl did learn to walk. One day she learned to take a few steps. The next month, she was running, and she hasn't stopped running since.

Jo Beth adds, "Oakley has become one of my biggest cheerleaders. She waves, smiles and greets everyone as she enters the Rehab, and certainly does not know a stranger. She may have been a fiery and spirited Angel in the beginning, but now she is a very determined, strong, and one of the sweetest Angels in my life. I look forward to my Wednesday afternoons with Oakley...and with her entire amazing family!"

REHAB 2025



Aaron Watson is a man forever looking to the horizon. Where other artists might rest on their laurels, he consistently presses onward to the next frontier, cutting through lazy industry wisdom in favor of success won on his own terms. He is the first independent male country artist ever to debut an album at No. 1 on the Billboard Country chart, a feat recognized in the Country Music Hall of Fame. He has earned a litany of prestigious awards, hundreds of millions of streams on his music, shared the stage with country music legends Willie Nelson and Alan Jackson, and raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for multiple charities. This next chapter of his trailblazing career sees him deep in the weeds on two projects: the first, an album of covers dedicated to his daughter; the second, a 2024-slated album of originals that promises to be his most daring and audacious release to date. "My goal is to put out the best country album in all of country music in 2024," he says simply, "It sounds crazy, but then pretty much everything I've done sounded crazy until I did it."

Watson hails from Amarillo in West Texas and began writing songs whilst still in high school. He began performing in college, eventually forming a band and developing a loyal following. Despite being approached by major labels, Watson chose the road less traveled and released his work independently. This turned out to be the right call when his album "Real Good Time" charted in the top ten nationwide on Country Billboard, an unheard of feat at the time. With the taste of success fresh on his lips, Watson pushed onward and created "Underdog", which became the first

released independently to chart at number one. "People told us that it had never been done. It was impossible. I don't put so much stock in that word anymore."

Success built upon success with Watson's follow up albums. However, 2020 heralded a slow down for the artist by way of the COVID-19 pandemic and an unexpected vocal cord surgery. "That time out reminded me what a blessing this is. To get to do what I love, sing the songs that I write and have people sing them along with me." Watson was keen to get back to his fans, and to make them feel like a part of the family more than ever before.

"Me and my thirteen year old daughter, Jolee Kate, had been talking a lot about music, particularly female singers who write their own stuff. I wanted her to understand the power that comes with owning your own voice." Out of those conversations came Cover Girl, a collection of covers of mold-breaking female country singers performed by Aaron, with his daughter joining him on vocals for one track. "I had no plans for the rest of the world to hear it, but the more

people I told, the more people loved it. So we're doing it as a full release, I'm so excited!"

Aaron Watson is nothing if not audacious, and his promise to fans that his next album of originals will be the best Country album of 2024 stands firm. By his own admission, the songs are, by-and-large, completed, yet Watson continues to push himself to make them better. "I love every second of what I get to do, but if making music is a marathon (and it is), I want to collapse to the ground the second after I cross the finish line. Nothing left to give." Aaron Watson is a man constantly reaffirming his dedication to the craft of songwriting, and it is this commitment to quality and treating his fans with respect that has proved him, time and again, to be the living North Star for country music's free and indomitable spirit.



REHAB 2025

Sister duo Tigirlily Gold has been playing music together since they could walk, and officially formed their band in high school. Growing up, they crisscrossed the mid-west, growing a fierce fan base and playing amphitheaters across their home-state of North Dakota. After moving to Nashville, they landed a weekly residence at Dierks Bentley's Whiskey Row on Nashville's famed lower Broadway. Playing four-hour sets, three to four nights a week, the sisters developed a performance style that's not only captivating and fun but shows just

After releasing their original song "Somebody Does," in 2021, the track topped the iTunes chart and Tigirlily Gold was signed to Monument Records. They released their self-titled, debut EP in July 2021, working with multi-Grammy Award Winner Shane McAnally, and hit the road with artists like Walker Hayes and Ashley McBryde. Now, the powerhouse duo embark on a new musical chapter with their debut album, Blonde, out now.

Blonde is a deeply personal project that includes tales of love and loss alongside powerful anthems and songs of female empowerment. Their debut single at country radio, "Shoot Tequila," reached the Top 40 and found viral success with millions of views across social media, and millions of streams across platforms. The song helped Tigirlily Gold get nominated for two CMT Awards and win their first

second top 40 radio single.
